## "Who Is Jesus?" Matthew 16:13-20

Intro: Who is Jesus? Why was he here 2,000 years ago?

- Jesus asks his disciples what others are saying about him
  - a. John the Baptist (cf. Mt 14:1-2)
  - b. Elijah (cf. Mal 4:5-6; 2 Kings 2:9-12)
  - Jeremiah, another prophet (cf. <u>Dt 18:18</u>; <u>Apocrypha</u>)
- II. Jesus asks the disciples who they say he is
  - a. "You are the Messiah" (Ps 2:2)
  - b. "the Son of the living God" (Mt 14:33)
- III. Jesus' beatitude: Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah
  - a. Revealed by the heavenly Father
  - b. Knowing Jesus is a gift: given, revealed
- IV. "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church"
  - a. Petros means "rock"
  - b. "church" means an assembly gathered for a purpose
  - c. "gates of Hades" = "powers of death" (cf. Is 38:10)
- V. The keys of the kingdom
  - a. Authority to "bind" and "loose"
  - b. Keys can open and they can lock
- VI. Then Jesus ordered them *not* to tell anyone who he was!
  - a. They knew who he was but not his true mission
  - b. What was their understanding of the Messiah?

<u>Close</u>: Our own identity is bound up with who we claim Jesus to be and what we believe his mission was (<u>Romans 10:9</u>). Next week we will look at why the disciples were not yet ready to tell people who Jesus was (<u>Matthew 16:21-28</u>).
