"Power, Purpose and Persecution"

<u>Acts 1-7</u>

<u>Intro</u>: The book of Acts is really the Gospel of Luke, Part 2. It is what Jesus *continued* to do, now through His disciples by the power of the Holy Spirit. They would witness to Jesus, and they would suffer for it.

- I. <u>Prelude: Prayer, Part 1 (Acts 1:14)</u>
 - a. They joined together constantly in prayer
- II. <u>Power with the Holy Spirit</u>
 - a. This was not the first appearance of the Holy Spirit
 - b. This was a unique outpouring of the Holy Spirit
 - c. The same power is in believers today
- III. Interlude: Prayer, Part 2 (Acts 2:42)
 - a. They devoted themselves...to prayer
- IV. Purpose witness to Jesus
 - a. What's all this power for?
 - b. The book of Acts is primarily a book of Words
 - c. The Greek word for "witness" is martyr
- V. <u>Persecution worthy suffering</u>
 - a. Jesus said this would happen
 - b. Jesus told them not to worry about what to say
 - c. Jesus said they would be blessed through suffering
- VI. <u>Postlude: Prayer, Part 3 (Acts 6:4)</u>
 - a. We...will give our attention to prayer

<u>Close</u>: In Acts 6 and 7 we read a stunning account of a man named Stephen. Stephen was filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, he witnessed to Jesus, and he was killed for it—while praying.
