"The Seven C's of Jonah 4"

Jonah 4:1-11

<u>Intro</u>: Have you ever been so angry you wanted "to die"?

I. <u>Content</u>

a. Jonah stews over God's mercy for the Ninevites, and over a plant. The LORD questions him about it.

II. Character

- God is "long in the nose" (compassionate and patient)
- b. Jonah is "short in the nose" (angry)

III. Concerns

a. Jonah was more concerned about a plant than the salvation of 120,000 souls. This concerned God.

IV. Corollaries

a. Jonah knew the Psalms of David. He should have taken <u>Psalm 37</u> to heart.

V. Comfort

a. The LORD's shade is better than a plant.

VI. Curiosities

- a. Jonah has one brief moment of happiness.
- b. Was Jonah's heart ever softened? Did he ever repent?

VII. Christ (Matthew 12:38-41)

a. Jesus *is* God's compassion for lost souls (<u>Luke 19:10</u>)

<u>Close</u>: God is sovereign and compassionate, while people are too often obstinate and "short in the nose."
