

## “What To Do With God’s Commands”

Mark 12:28-34; Deuteronomy 6:1-9

Intro: The LORD gives us ten ways to help us keep his commands.

- I. Have them on your heart (Deut. 6:6)
  - a. “I meditate on [God’s law] all day long.” Psalm 119:97
- II. Impress them on your children (Deut. 6:7)
  - a. Children observe what their parents do
- III. Talk about them when you sit at home (Deut. 6:7)
  - a. Talk with Jesus and your family about God’s law
- IV. Talk about them on the road (Deut. 6:7)
  - a. Take God’s Word with you in the car, to work, etc.
- V. Consider God and his Word at bedtime (Deut. 6:7)
  - a. “On my bed I remember you...” Psalm 63:6
- VI. Think of the LORD and his Word in the morning (Deut. 6:7)
  - a. *Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love*
- VII. Tie the LORD’s commands on your hands (Deut. 6:8)
  - a. The hands represent all that we do
- VIII. Bind them on your foreheads (Deut. 6:8)
  - a. Like *spiritual* reality goggles
- IX. Write them on the doorframes of your houses (Deut. 6:9)
  - a. What was on their doorframes 40 years earlier?
- X. Write them on your gates (Deut. 6:9)
  - a. Coming in, going out, always walking with the LORD
