In Luke's account, when Peter first met Jesus (<u>Luke 5:1-11</u>), he reluctantly <u>obeyed him</u>, which led to an astonishing experience of the <u>holiness</u> and <u>fear</u> of the Lord.

I. <u>Children of Obedience – Those Who Hear God</u>

- a. To obey is to hear under (ὑπακοή in Greek)
- b. We have a new schematic for life
- c. Though you didn't know it, the old schematic was evil

II. <u>Children of Holiness – Those Who See God</u>

- a. Holiness is a state of being; doing flows from it
- b. God's holiness is in our (born-again) DNA
- c. "Be holy" is much more than a command

III. Children of Reverence – Those Who Fear God

- a. Does the world fear God?
- b. Sets us apart: fear God (and no one/nothing else!)
- c. Greek *phobos*: "panic, fear, terror, alarm...reverence"
- d. A glimpse of God's holiness makes us strangers here

When Jesus says, "Don't be afraid," he opens our ears, our eyes, and our hearts to live in his loving embrace.
